Student Achievements

Michaelmas Term 2014

Cricket

- In a final delayed from the Summer Term, the Under 15s secured the Warwickshire County Cricket Cup 2014.

Rugby

Fencing

- Zachary Hamilton finished with a silver medal in the Under 15 category of the England Youth Championships with team mate Archie Watt achieving Under 13 bronze.
- Thomas Woodland won Under 15 gold at the Malling MX LPJS Sabre.
- Zachary Hamilton won Under 15 silver, Joe Pocknell Under 15 bronze and Louis Bedford Under 11 silver at the Hendon LPJS Sabre.
- Barnaby Halliwell won the Under 14 gold with Felix Crabtree taking Under 12 gold at the Stratford Sabre. Louis Bedford and Joe Pocknell won Under 12 and Under 14 bronze respectively.
- Caspian Watt won the bronze Under 20 at the Leon Paul Junior Sabre.
- Sabrina Evans won silver at the Leon Paul Novice Open.
- Our Under 18 team won its first adult team event at the Hamlet Open Team Sabre.
- Chloe Halliwell became the first K.E.S. girl to represent Great Britain in the Under 17 level at the Meylan European Circuit event in France. She also became the first K.E.S. girl to represent Great Britain in an Under 20 World Cup event when she took part in the Sosnowiec Junior World Cup in Poland. Later she represented Great Britain in another European Under 17 Circuit tournament in Germany.
- Zachary Hamilton and Thomas Jackson also faced international competition, representing Great Britain at the 2014 School Games with Hamilton winning team gold with England and individual bronze and Jackson winning team silver with Wales. Hamilton and Caspian Watt also fenced for Great Britain in the Meylan European Circuit tournament while Watt and Jackson represented Great Britain at the European Circuit event in Germany.

Rowing

- Peter Boyes and Will Lindsay became the first K.E.S. crew to qualify for the National Championships final in July.
- Daniel Wilkinson, Sam Casement, Harry Forty, Ed Beighton and Joshua North (Cox) won the Junior 18 Fours at the Evesham Junior Head.
