Year 7 Course summary:					
<p>Students begin Latin in Year 7. They are encouraged to read accurately and to develop a vocabulary of 111 words, enriching their word power in English and making connections with other languages. The course explores the story of the earliest foundation of Rome from the fall of Troy to the creation of the Roman republic. This provides a focus for story-telling, entering imaginatively into a different world and exploring moral values. The most challenging aspect of the course is the analysis and application of grammatical concepts: in particular subject, object and verb, agreement, different word order and some new grammatical terms.</p>
