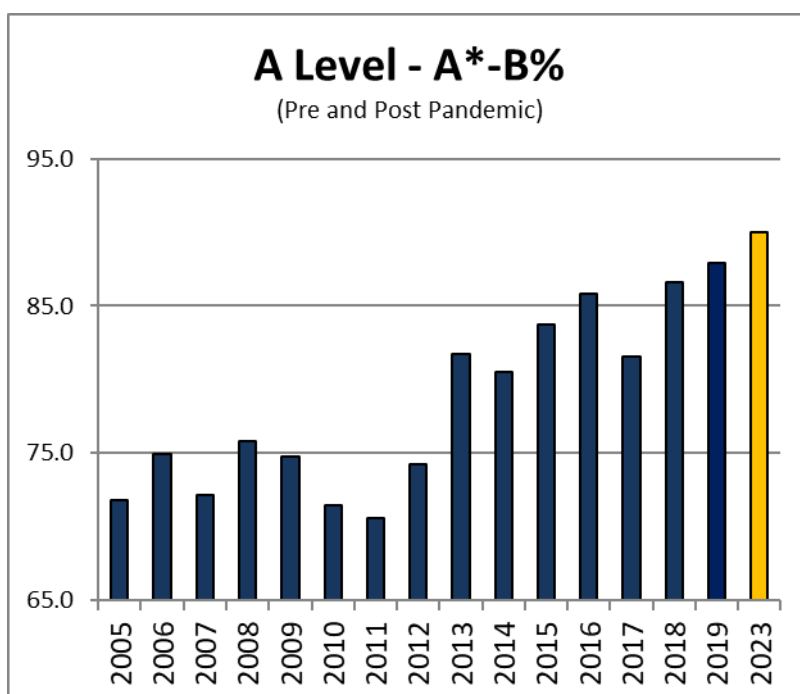

## A Level Results 2023

King Edward VI School students are celebrating another year of record-breaking A Level results with **90%** of papers graded A\*/B. Once again, these results mean that K.E.S. has one of the country's top 10 co-educational state Sixth Forms and the highest performing Sixth Form in Warwickshire - state or independent.

Ninety-six students obtained three A grades or better, including twenty-two who obtained the grades to take their places at Oxbridge colleges. The stand-out performances were achieved by nine students who obtained four A\* grades: **Mohsin Ahmed, Rory Armstrong-Ortiz, Matthew Campbell, Daisy Hague, George Halstead, Lucas Kirk, Teertha Nitin, Daniel Reynolds and Jenny Tian.**

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**Bennet Carr**, Headmaster, said *“I am delighted that our students were able to rise to this year’s unique challenges so magnificently. These were the first A Level examinations with normal grading since the pandemic and also the first public examinations this cohort have taken due to the cancellation of GCSEs in 2021. Indeed, the Secretary of State for Education had warned that those receiving their A Level results should brace themselves for lower grades than last year. For our students to achieve record results in these circumstances is therefore quite remarkable. It is not only tribute to their hard work and dedication, but also to that of their teachers who have prepared and taught them so effectively over the last two years.”*
